





# TennCare's proven Community Health Worker infrastructure has improved quality and saved \$60.7M.

## CHWs address the root causes of low quality.



**"Growing up, my family always taught me to give back even when they didn't have."**





...and \$53.5M in avoided hospitalizations.


## Here are cost-neutral ways to sustain TennCare's CHW infrastructure.



- Require practices in the patient-centered medical home (PCMH) model to include CHWs in their care teams as a criteria for obtaining PCMH recognition.
- Require Health Link providers to develop or partner with evidence-based CHW programs.



- Include a Provider Network Requirement that MCOs must contract with evidence-based CHW programs.
- Require MCOs to report semi-annually on CHW program reach and impact.
- Require MCOs to include CHWs as care managers.



- Allocate shared savings achieved under the Section 1115 Demonstration Waiver to evidence-based CHW programs that serve pregnant women and newborns.



- Include evidence-based CHW programs in Rural Health Transformation Plan in order to improve access and health outcomes for rural residents.
